

**Scotland Island Residents' Association Incorporated (SIRA)
Committee of Management (SIRAC)
Parks and Reserves Working Group**



The Constitution of the Scotland Island Residents' Association Incorporated (SIRA) lists as an Object of the Association: "to encourage and promote any necessary development of Scotland Island and adjacent mainland areas".

The Constitution of the Scotland Island Residents' Association vests in the Committee of Management (SIRAC) the "power to perform all such acts and do all such things as appear to the committee to be necessary or desirable for the proper management of the affairs of the association" (Article 12), and provides for delegation to a sub-committee "the exercise of such of the functions of the committee as are specific in the instrument [of delegation]" (Article 20).

The Committee (SIRAC) delegates to the Parks and Reserves Working Group the following specific functions:

- To promote a well maintained space for community access, use and enjoyment, preserving as far as possible the natural environment of each area.
- To support the maintenance and enhancement of the Parks and Reserves consistent with the natural environment of each location and conducive to social use and enjoyment.
- To consult with Pittwater Council, Bush Care Contractors, Bush Care Volunteers and the SIRAC Roads and Drainage Sub-Committee to achieve a coordinated approach to maintenance of Parks and Reserves.
- To establish a team to guide and undertake activities for each of the Parks and Reserves.
- To identify and recommend to SIRAC areas for maintenance and enhancement at each site
- To organise working bees for general clean-up activities.
