



“Operation lights on or its lights out” – Marine Area Command

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Broken Bay Water Police have launched a new campaign- Operation lights on or its lights out - encouraging boating enthusiasts to make sure their lights are on when navigating at night.

“Navigating at night requires special care,” said Detective Senior Sergeant Chris Morgan, from Broken Bay Water Police.

“As part of Operation lights on or its lights out, Broken Bay Water Police will be targeting vessels in numerous areas throughout the command, making sure that they are using their lights at night;”

“Displaying your lights correctly and sticking to the speed limit helps keep our waterways safer for all users. Police want waterways to be safe for everyone and are encouraging people to navigate responsibly;”

“Boaties need to remember that although they may be able to see others, if they don’t have their lights on, others can’t see them. It really is a case of lights on or else it could be lights out” D/Snr Sgt Morgan said.

Operation lights on or its lights out will be an on-going campaign within the Broken Bay Water Police.

Posters promoting the campaign will be distributed throughout Pittwater, Brisbane Water and the Hawkesbury river.

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
