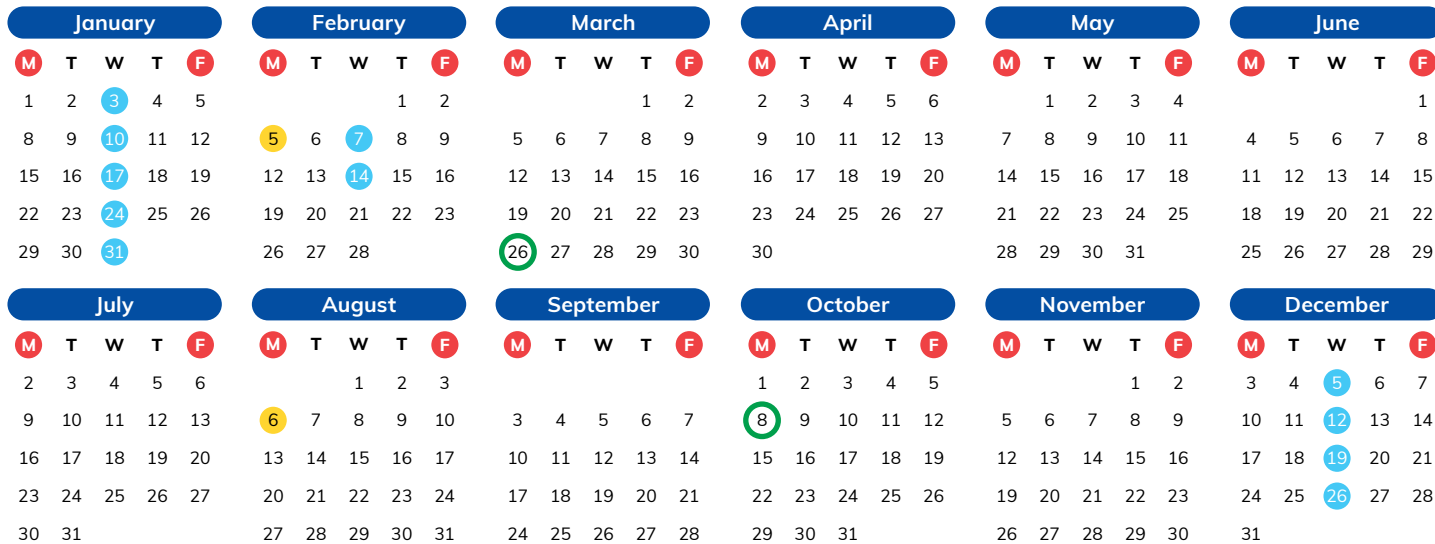


# Waste & Recycling Calendar 2018

## Bulky Goods Clean Up

visit [northernbeaches.nsw.gov.au](http://northernbeaches.nsw.gov.au)  
for your collection details

- ✓ Frames with glass removed  
(break glass down, wrap in newspaper and put in garbage bin)
- ✓ Paint tins and fuel containers are accepted with the lid off and no liquid
- ✓ Manageable quantities of non branded delivery pallets,
- ✓ Hot water systems (empty)
- ✗ TVs & computers
- ✗ Building / renovation material
- ✗ Car parts, tyres & batteries
- ✗ Gas bottles & extinguishers
- ✗ Vegetation
- ✗ Cardboard & paper
- ✗ Windows / glass / mirrors

Please note:

- Make sure nails are not protruding from items
- Remove doors from fridges and furniture for safety reasons
- Place metals and whitegoods in a separate pile



## Collection from roadside only

Maximum amount is 3 cubic metres. Do not place materials at public wharves or private wharves and jetties. Fines apply for illegal dumping.

**Unacceptable items will not be collected**

- ✓ Office paper
- ✓ Newspaper / magazines
- ✓ Phone books
- ✓ Flattened clean cardboard
- ✓ Envelopes
- ✓ Window envelopes
- ✓ Egg cartons



- ✗ Plastic bags
- ✗ Wax cardboard
- ✗ Dirty parts of pizza box
- ✗ Food soiled paper
- ✗ Milk / juice cartons
- ✗ Nappies

# Garden Organics

## Roadside Collection

- ✔ Maximum amount is 2 cubic metres, similar to a small box trailer
- ✔ Place garden organics in a hard sided container.
- ✔ Branches to be max 1.2m long and 75mm thick tied with twine.
- ✘ Plastic bags
- ✘ General waste
- ✘ Food scraps / kitchen waste\*
- ✘ Painted & treated timber
- ✘ Soil
- ✘ Large tree stumps and roots



grass cuttings



large branches no wider than 75mm



cut-up palm fronds



tubers without soil



twigs



leaf litter



**100% of the garden organics collected will be recycled at Kimbriki Resource Recovery Centre.**

Material presented in plastic, nylon or hessian bags, cardboard or foam boxes or untied bundles will not be collected.  
Fines apply for illegal dumping.

## Illegal Dumping

No vegetation or prohibited materials to be placed at public or private wharves. Fines for illegal dumping will apply. Dumped material pollutes the environment and can harm wildlife and native flora. If you see someone dumping material in our reserves, wharves or bushland areas, please take note of any registration details, description of the vehicle/vessel, person, date and time, then report it to Council.



Any dumped material should be reported (whether the person responsible is known or not) so that Council can take action and investigate the matter. Did you know that you can be fined or prosecuted for transporting waste to a place that cannot legally accept it?

## Public Wharf Bins

Public wharf garbage bins are provided for the disposal of domestic garbage waste only.

Please do not dispose of construction waste, chemical waste or garden organic waste in the garbage bins provided on the public wharves.

Building materials, gas bottles, car / boat parts, motor oil, paint, computer and batteries



can be taken to either Kimbriki or Belrose Resource Recovery Centres. See page 2 of this waste calendar to learn where to dispose of these products. Onsite household composting is recommended for garden organics. Chemical waste can be disposed of in the Household Chemical Cleanouts.

## Report Illegal Dumping - on the spot fines up to \$4,000

If you see someone dumping material please take note of the registration, description of vehicle and person, date and time and report to Council.

### What to do with household chemicals

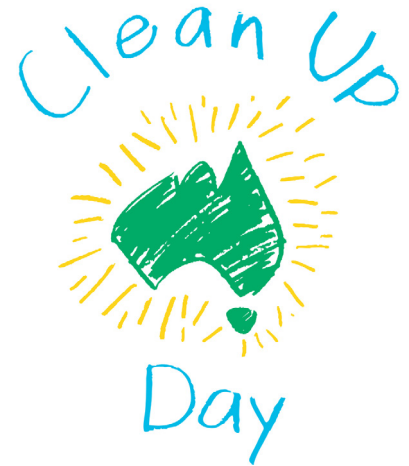

- ✔ Paint and paint-related products
- ✔ Motor oils, fuels and fluids
- ✔ Gas bottles
- ✔ Pool chemicals
- ✔ Hobby chemicals (photography etc.)
- ✔ Pesticides and herbicides
- ✔ Solvents and household cleaners
- ✔ Batteries
- ✔ Fire extinguishers
- ✔ Acids and alkalis
- ✔ Fluorescent tubes
