## What do I do with..?

#### Computers and TVs

Drop off TVs, computers (and related components), printers, scanners, projectors, cables and speakers at Kimbriki Resource Recovery Centre, Belrose Resource Recovery Centre, Harvey Norman Balgowlah or \*Officeworks (\*except TVs).

#### Household chemicals

For drop off locations and Chemical CleanOut events visit epa.nsw.gov.au or call the EPA Environment Line on 131 555.

### Batteries

Drop off batteries for recycling at Aldi, Battery World, Bunnings, Woolworths and Kimbriki Resource Recovery Centre.

# How do I present my vegetation?



Scotland Island residents receive two scheduled vegetation roadside collections per year. **Refer to calendar for dates.** 

Please present your vegetation in tied bundles or a hard sided container. **Material** presented in plastic, nylon or hessian bags, cardboard or foam boxes and untied bundles will not be collected. Fines apply for illegal dumping.

Council may also schedule additional and separate fine fuel collections to mitigate bushfire risk and collections may not be scheduled every year. Timing of these may vary depending on the season and the bushfire threat. Residents will be notified if/when these additional fine fuels collections are scheduled.

Please contact Council to report a damaged or missing bin, or if you see any illegal dumping.


# Your Waste & Recycling Guide



Items must be in the bin with the lid closed flat to avoid litter



Vegetation must be presented in a hard sided container or bundled and tied.

#### Container Recycling

Every Monday Roadside Crates

Clean containers including:

- Glass jars / bottles
- Milk / juice cartons
- Empty aerosols
- Steel / aluminium cans
- Plastic containers / bottles
- Plastic bags / cling wrap\*
- Food waste\*
- Windows / glass / mirrors\*
- Ceramics / drinking glass\*
- Polystyrene\*
- White glass

## Vegetation

Twice yearly Roadside Service

- Branches max 75mm thick
- Branches max 1.2m long
- Garden / grass clippings
- Cut up palm fronds
- Twigs / leaves
- Flowers
- Food / general waste
- Boxed vegetation
- Plastic bags\*
- Building / furniture timber
- Soil / animal faeces
- Large tree stumps

# Have you considered giving your bulky goods a new life?

Most bulky goods items collected will be compacted, crushed and sent to landfill. Consider the many ways you can sell, recycle or upcycle before you place items out for collection.

# **Bulky Goods Collection Service**

Scotland Island residents receive two scheduled bulky goods collections per year. Materials must only be placed out the weekend before the scheduled bulky goods collection date.



Building and renovation material must not be placed out for bulky goods collections - you should ask your building contractor for a receipt to show any construction waste has been properly disposed of.



Hot water systems **must** be emptied



Doors are removed from all whitegoods and large items dismantled



Ensure nails are not protruding from any items



Maximum 12 fence palings



Remove glass from frames (break glass, wrap in paper and place in garbage bin)



Items must not be longer than 1.8m or heavier than 40kg (except whitegoods



Up to 2 unbranded pallets are accepted



Metal items should be presented in a separate pile for recycling

Collection from roadside only. Maximum amount is 3 cubic metres. Do not place materials at public wharves or private wharves and jetties. Fines apply for illegal dumping. Unacceptable items will not be collected
