

Confidentiality Agreement for Committee Members

This agreement is for SIRAC members and to anybody providing paid or voluntary assistance for SIRA where they may have access to potentially confidential information.

Confidentiality is an obligation that restricts an organisation from using or disclosing any information in a way which is contrary to the interests of the person or organization which provided it in the first place. Confidentiality can be defined as a mode of managing private information.

Privacy is a broader concept than confidentiality and relates to an individual's ability to control the extent to which their personal information, enabling identification is available to others.

Privacy and the protection of confidential information is a serious issue and one of which everyone needs to be aware of. Failure to adhere to privacy legislation can have legal ramifications.

Declaration

- I understand that, while I am a member of SIRAC or providing assistance to them, I may have access to personal information collected for particular purposes. Such personal information includes the identity of, and personal information about individual persons.
- I understand that I may also have access to confidential information relating to other matters or organizations.
- I undertake not to knowingly access any personal information or confidential information unless such information is necessary to undertake some SIRAC activity
- I undertake to not divulge any personal information or confidential information and I
 undertake to not use any personal information or confidential information, except as
 authorised by the whole SIRAC Committee
