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	QUORUM AND MEETING CHAIR	
	In accordance with rule 19 of the SIRA Constitution, it was determined that a quorum was	
	reached at 19:22 with 5 Committee Members present.	
	In the absence of SIRA President and Vice President the members present were required to choose who would preside the meeting and decided that the Secretary (Hubert van Mierlo) would preside.	
1.	Will SIRA make a submission to the delegate for the NSW Boundary Review or not	
	The meeting discussed this question. Although initially not all members present felt that it was in the best interest of SIRA to make a submission, it was recognised that that a Survey was issued asking SIRA members whether they should make a submission. The interim result of 80% in favour of making a submission, meant that it would not be easy to justify a decision contrary to the survey outcome.	
	The meeting decided as follows: In favour of making a submission, unless the final result of the Survey shows a majority of members <u>against</u> making a submission.	
2.	In case a decision in the affirmative at point 1 above, decide the actual text of the submission.	
	A lengthy discussion followed weighing up the pros and cons of including certain text and survey result. The meeting came to a conclusion and decided upon the following:
