Public Forum

Response to president's report - unregistered vehicles - access for those with mobility issues.

It was pointed out that at this point there is no way that people with mobility issues are able to access the ferry. They have a legal right to access their homes. It was stated that SIRA has always supported those with a disability. It was stated that at part of the Road and Transport meeting of 2017, there was room for 6 buggies.

Re the registration of buggies, the Minister of Transport said it was not transport but roads. Rory will present again via a friend. Great opportunity next week at the cafe. A council rep is coming to respond to questions.

For SIRA to do the level of secretary work that people seem to expect and demand, it probably needs to be a paid role as the expectations are very high of a volunteer. Either that or people need to reduce their expectations and demands.

Current placement of blocks was a response to a reported near miss of a child in the park? Can they be removed until a proper discussion with the community?

First resolution proposed and voted on: "That SIRA forthwith request of Council the temporary removal or moving of the stone bollards to allow for the original area of parking and of vehicle turning". Moved Ian White, seconded Mark Martin.

It was suggested that the Comms team push SIRA to respond. Try to present to next week's meeting a galvanised sentiment, opinion. We can do a survey and present it to the council.

It was stated that Council lobbied the State Government to have buggies registered under the act of Parliament: re Lord Howe Island. The Minister decided to withdraw his support.

SIRA will look at the vision going forward. Every issue we face we have to make a decision, is it good for the community? EG: People like convenience. It's convenient for a few but is it in the best interest of the larger community. People with mobility issues need to use Tennis. That's the bottom line.

Discussion focussed on: is it legal to deny people access? There needs to be access to the flat. How do we embrace diversity like this? People have a right to access their homes. Whether their disability is visible or not. What happens if we have a fire? It interferes with safety. Commonwealth legislation.

It was stated that the Commonwealth government told the council it had to be compliant with disability access and the council said, how? It's impossible.

Second Resolution re survey: "That the draft survey be shared to the Communications subcommittee for proofing, then circulated to the full committee for comment, then published to the Scotland Island community by Survey Monkey or equivalent service. The Comms team shall endeavour to have the survey out to the community as a matter of urgency". Moved Ian White, seconded by Boyd Attwell, Passed unanimously.
